St Mary's governors have excellent attendance at meetings and we have only had to cancel a meeting because it was not "quorate" (the number of governors needed to ensure that legal decisions can be made).

Governing Body effectiveness and impact

For the Governing Body, this has again been a very busy year. The main priority during this period has been the focus on the any gaps in learning for the children through assessments, as well as the health and emotional wellbeing of school staff, parents, pupils and governors. Governors have undertaken many different forms of training varying from Prevent, Safeguarding and Ofsted. We continue to be committed to ensuring consistent and effective governance whilst not losing sight of the pressures both at work and at home for our school community, particularly in relation to cost of living.

The Governing Body would like to thank parents and staff for the smooth transition of the 32.5 hour school week trial and supporting all the requirements of early morning booster classes and National Tutoring after school. The school has continued to focus on ensuring we support children with any gaps in their learning and the government are making the funding available again this year. The school will also continue working to support children and staff with their emotional wellbeing.

This year the Governors did not have the opportunity to undertake a skills matrix as part of an evaluation exercise due to concentrating on the new Ofsted framework. An evening training session was held for Governors on the new Ofsted protocols, looking at possible questions and areas of focus for Governor interviews. The skills matrix and evaluation exercise will be undertaken in September with our new governors as well as the link governor roles mentioned earlier.

The Finance and Personnel Governors' monitoring of budgets and forecasts has again been crucial this year. As part of Governors' accountability, we have been reviewing the three-year budget projections ensuring the budgets are achieved. Over recent years it has been difficult to predict how things will be in three years' time, but usually there have been new Government financial incentives, grants and funding which have often made the bleak outcome brighter. This year the predictions have been a concern and the Governors have pondered different scenarios, solutions and outcomes. Having warned of this, we understand this is a national problem and are aware of other schools that are already in deficit. With the onset of increased energy costs and cost of living crisis, the outlook looks difficult. If families are suffering financial difficulties, assistance may be given through help with heating fuel etc via the household benefit scheme. We would urge families to check their eligibility status by logging https://pps.lafl.ora.uk/. lf you have any difficulties please onto contact itaberer@stmarysuxbridge.org.uk in the strictest confidence. Even though all children in KS1 and KS2 will now receive Universal Free School Meals for a year, it is important to still apply if you are on income support as the household benefit scheme could assist and also the school will receive funding to help with those particular pupils' learning. These strategies are carried out very discreetly in groups without undue attention.

We have just signed up for The Key via our portal, Governor Hub, which a national information service providing guidance and training for Governors. We will continue to share our training experiences with each other, with a particular a focus on the new Ofsted framework, safeguarding and Governors' statutory duties, **as** well as continuing the schedule of policy review and agenda cycle.

This year, Mrs Amanda Childs has been successfully appointed as LA Governor. Mr Tony Dias and Ms Lisa Pearcey have joined the Full Governing Body this year and brought with them their experience and knowledge. Tony has been involved with the voluntary sector via sport and has sat on the Finance and Personnel Committees. Lisa has experience of property management and is an advocate for recycling and eco and has sat on the Premises/Health & Safety Committee. Mrs Inkpen has served four years on the Governing Body as a staff member and has been a very valuable asset with her classroom knowledge, as well as her experience as a counsellor. More recently too her support in class and group work with Phonics has meant a 100% achievement for the pupils in their government assessments. In line with giving opportunities for all staff to serve on the Governing body, Mrs Chandarana will serve from September 2023 as Staff Governor. There were no nominations for the Parent Governor post advertised this month and therefore Mrs Bea Posada has agreed to stand for another term. Bea has undertaken a significant amount training covering many aspects of her role, which is a huge benefit to the Governing Body and her offer to accept another term of office is much appreciated.

The Governors would like to take this opportunity to thank Miss Shevlin and all the staff for their hard work, commitment and dedication to another successful year at St Mary's. This year, many peer group reviews and moderations have been undertaken in a number of subjects. During these visits, the behaviour and outstanding manners of our pupils has been praised. KS2 have also undertaken a fitness regime and experimented with Moki bands monitoring their steps. We have also seen another large group of pupils making their First Holy Communion and would like to congratulate them.

We thank the PTA for their continued dedication, supporting with fundraising and community cohesion.

We welcome Ms Shannon Power as an SMSA. Shannon has helped with the recent sports day and classroom cover.

Finally, thank you to all our parents for their continued involvement and support in our St Mary's community.

Looking ahead to next year, a huge focus will be the forthcoming Ofsted inspection and the Diocesan RE inspection, in addition to the important items mentioned earlier in this report.

With the prospect of financial pressures, the governors would be interested to hear from any parents, employers/businesses who would like to establish community links with our school and any match funding incentives that could also benefit St Mary's.
