

Morning Drop-off All pupils (from Reception to Yr6) arrive from 8.40am via our Rockingham Road entrance. This gate is locked at 8.45am each morning.

#### Collection Times

All classes (Reception to Year 6) finish school at 3.15pm. Afternoon Nursery finishes at 3.30pm. Please use our <u>1-way system</u> when collecting, after school, to avoid congestion in our Rockingham Close alleyway.

#### Pupil Bags in School

We ask that pupils only bring in book bags (and draw string P.E bags for their P.E uniform). Each child only has a single peg for these bags (in most cases in the main corridor) and we **do not have the space for large rucksacks** or other similar bags. Thank you in advance.

#### <u>PE Kits</u>

Each class has two set days for PE each week. Pupils may wear their PE kits and trainers to school on the days they have PE. Pupils should not wear their trainers to school on any other day – thank you.



# St. Mary's Catholic Primary School School Newsletter

#### Dear Parent/Carer,

On Tuesday, pupils in Years 4, 5 and 6 took part in Lego Robotics STEM workshops. The children found out how to use the Lego block coding software to control motors, lights, sounds, pictures and text using a tablet. They then followed instructions to build a model robot which they programmed. The children were encouraged to be creative by 'upgrading and improving' their models. Pupils in Upper KS2 were taught how to write algorithms to program a motion sensor. The sessions were great fun and packed full of learning!

Year 1's Class Assembly took place yesterday. The children performed for pupils, in the morning, followed by their family members in the afternoon - teaching us lots of interesting facts about different explorers through time. Their performances, singing (and dances) were fantastic. Well done Year 1!

Our Year 4 pupils also visited the British Museum, in London, on the same day. They took part in an Ancient Eygptian workshop and they explored the Egyptian galleries hunting for different artefacts from this period of time.

Today, our Year 5 pupils visited Ruislip Manor to take part in an event called Global Lullabies. They have been practising a musical piece, over the last few weeks, and then presented this to an audience this morning. Our Reception and Year 1 pupils are due to attend a free Rugbytots sessions this afternoon – we will be offering a new Rugbytots after school club in the new academic year.

### Transition Morning - Tuesday

We are holding a Transition morning (on Tuesday). All pupils will spend a lesson with their new teacher (for September) in their new classroom. Following this lesson, they will spend their breaktime in their new playground. Staff have spent this half term preparing the children for this transition and we have been doing extra work with those pupils who find transitions more difficult - including some of our SEN pupils. Please speak to your child's current teacher if you have any concerns.

### Year 6 – End of KS2 SATs Tests

We were sent our school's end of KS2 SATs results this week. Individual pupil results will be included in the Yr6 reports (sent home today). Our pupils did extremely well with our school achieving well above the National averages in the Reading, Maths, Grammar, Punctuation & Spelling (GPS) tests. There was a very high % of pupils working at Greater Depth across all subjects. Well done Year 6 (and Mr Morris and Mrs George) for all of their hard work. You can see a summary of our school's results below:

#### Attendance

We are sure that like us, you as parents and carers, realise the importance of attendance and punctuality. At St. Mary's, we continue to work hard to try to raise attendance levels and to reduce instances of lateness. There is much evidence to show that good attendance plays a vital role in helping your child to achieve their potential. We also know that poor attendance can lead to other problems for children. **How can you help your child attend school regularly?:** 

- Talk to your child about school. Make sure your child understands why school is important.
- Get everything ready for school the night before.
- Arrange appointments before or after school or during the school holidays.
- Take holidays during school holidays and not during term time.
- Set your alarm and your child's alarm clock- see who can beat the clock!
- Only grant days at home for genuine illness (you will know)!
- If your child is slightly under the weather, still send them into school- children often start feeling better as the day goes on and they get busy, and if the school is worried, we will call you.
